READING RESOURCES

Education from the bench is a valuable and little used tool in Family Court. With greater than 85% of litigants representing themselves, the judge is likely the best source of education for parents in the process of divorce. Judges can refer parents, grandparents, and other parties to books, websites, classes and other educational resources. Parties can be encouraged to learn more about a host of topics such as child development, co-parenting, step-parenting, decreasing conflict, being child centered and more. For parents who are illiterate or impoverished, the court may print out materials for them and ask that a court advocate, counselor, family member or librarian share the information with the parent.
